Garnett lost her father to pancreatic cancer when she was 16 years old. She says that it was her father who inspired her to work hard in school and strive for excellence. "It had always been his dream for me to attend and graduate from college. Education had always been incredibly important to him, and I share this belief with him. As a result of losing my father, I looked for outside scholarships to help fund my education. When I came across the Boxercraft Scholarship, I immediately connected with it and could not be more thankful to put this money towards my education and live out my father's dream for me."
